
























# Sportsman Champion JOHN MURPHY

John got off to a fast start when he captured the checkered flag in the second race of the year. In the first seven races of the season John finished no lower than fifth place, and he finished out of the top ten only four times. Along with his one win at Silver Spring, John also picked up a win at Williams Grove Speedway where he was the 1982 sportsman point champion also.

With this point championship John has now become the all-time leading point champion in the sportsman division. John will now try and break Don Comerer's mark of five track championships. Congratulations to John and the crew of the no. 30 for their outstanding season!



# Limited Late Model Champion JEFF SMITH




Jeff Smith of Blain put together his best season ever in his racing career to capture his very first Silver Spring Speedway limited late model point championship.

Congratulations to Jeff, Brian Mullen and the crew on their outstanding season and their very first point championship!





At the end of the year there was a special 40 lap race held for the limited late models and the Enola driver drove an excellent race to pick up the win in the Foust Machine - Locke's Automotive Camaro.



### Ed Jones No. 43

Ed Jones finished in third place in the points in the Jimmy Shomper owned, Leach's Sunoco - Nick's Enola Hotel - Mechanicsburg Sports Car Center - Erb's Glass no. 43 Camaro. Ed grabbed only one win the first half of the season but in the second half he was almost unbeatable. Ed put together a string of eight top five finishes in-a-row that included six wins, one third and one fifth place finish. The Shermansdale driver followed this with another string of five top ten finishes in-a-r-w that had three wins and a second and fourth place finishes. Jones found the championship races to his liking as he won two 25 lap races and he captured the big Limited Late Model 50 lap race.



Jerry started the year off with six top ten finishes in-a-row, and late in the year he had two second place finishes in-a-row. The quiet Annville driver showed that you don't have to have alot of wins to finish in the top five in points.



### Scott Ausherman No. 47

Last year's Rookie-of-the-Year Scott Ausherman teamed up with car owner Jerry Burkett at the start of this season to form the BRAT (Burkett-Reider-Ausherman Team) Racing Team. The team came out flying as Scott got a third place the first night and on the third night he captured his very first win at Silver Spring. Scott then drove very consistently the rest of the year in the Reider's Hardware sponsored no. 47, and late in the season he grabbed his second win of the 82 campaign. In the Sportsman 100 Scott appeared to have the race won until a lapped car spun out in front of him and Scott crashed into the car. After the season was over Scott towed his sprint car to the mile track at Syracuse where he qualified for the big race, Scott turned in a faster time in time trials than such drivers as Smokey Snellbaker, Lee Osborne and Jimmy Horton.



### Rich Eichelberger No. 8

Sixth Place - 1435 Points 10 Top Five Finishes Three Feature Wins Nine Heat Wins Failed to Qualify 1 Time


The 1982 season found Rich once again behind the wheel of the Buck Meyers owned, D&M Auto Servicenter no. 8. The first three races of the season found the no. 8 being bothered by mechanical problems but "Ike" put it all together the fifth week when he took his first checkered flag of the year. In July Rich got red hot when he put together a string of nine top ten finishes in-a-row, including one win. Rich picked up one more win at Silver Spring and he also had a win at Williams Grove Speedway. "Ike" was the leading heat winner this year and on May 1st he set a new ten lap track record with the time of 2:55.4. Rich also holds the one lap track record of 16.79.



### Charlie Kope No. 116

For the fifth year in-a-row, Charlie Kope finished the season in the top fifteen in points. Charlie got off to a fast start as he had four top ten finishes in-a-row in the first four races. Charlie then sat out the next two races after blowing an engine but after he came back he was one of the hottest non-Chevrolet racers on the track. Although he didn't pick up a win this season, the "Sneaky Snake" put together a very consistent year in the Terry Bitting owned no. 116 Mustang to grab this fine top five point finish. The highlight of the season for Charlie was a fine fifth place finish in the Limited Late Model 50.




### Paul Orendo No. 3



Once again Warren Hursh and car owned Keith Billet teamed up for a top fifteen finish in the points. Warren took his first checkered flag of the year in the Kohler's Well Drilling no. 2 Camaro, on the fourth week of the season. At the mid-way point of the 1982 season, Warren had a string of five top five finishes that included two firsts, a second, one third and a fourth place finish, and one of those wins was a 25 lap championship race. Late in the year Keith Billet decided to sell the car and Warren was left without a ride which hurt his chances for a higher finish in the points. The highlight of the season for the York driver was his setting the fast time for the 50 lap race, 19.83 seconds for one lap.



### Ron Heisey No. 56

Failed to Qualify 2 Times

1982 found Ron Heisey once again behind the wheel of the Jack Warfield - Ron Heisey no. 56. Early in the season Ron did something that he hadn't done since April 20, 1974, and that was capture a feature win. Ron waited until the last turn of the last lap in the second sportsman race of the year at Williams Grove to streak into the lead to get the long overdue win. At Silver Spring Ron found the double point races to his liking as he had a fifth, a fourth and an eighth in the three extra lap events. In the Sportsman 100 the New Cumberland driver drove an outstanding race to finish in second place in the LPS Chassis, RR Automotive - Lawrence Chevrolet - Wayne's Jet Shop racer.



### John Yinger No. 15

Failed to Qualify 1 Time


For the second year in-a-row, John Yinger finished the season in tenth place in points. In the first half of the season John would finish in the top ten two races in-a-row and then he would miss the top ten one week, and then have two top ten finishes again. The Harrisburg driver took three wins in five weeks but after that he failed to finish in the top ten the last five weeks, which kept him from finishing higher in the points.

During the winter months car owner R.W. Lutz purchased a new Lloyd built racer and R.W. got Ree Smith to be the head mechanic and Steve Baker to do the engine work. Put Dwight Leib behind the wheel and you have the makings of a race team that is going to be in victory lane alot. The first three weeks found the A1 Automotive team getting the bugs worked out of the car but on the fourth week of the season the no. A1 was sitting in victory lane. A.D. then captured the double point - extra laps Memorial Day and Fourth of July Championship races, along with a fourth place in the Labor Day championship race. The best was yet to come as Dwight captured the sportsman 100 race at the end of the season. Dwight won the Sportsman 100 after going to the rear of the field after being involved in the John Murphy flip. Dwight delighted the fans with the way that he threw the car into the turns, which earned him the nickname of "A.D. Slideways."




### **Denny Deitch No. 45**

### Ron Walborn No. 7


Ninth Place - 1180 Points 13 Top Ten Finishes 1 Consy Win Failed to Qualify 1 Time

10th Place - 1170 Points 9 Top Ten Finishes 9 Heat Wins Failed to Qualify 3 Times



The highlight of the year for Comerer was an outstanding third place finish in the sportsman 100. By putting together a very consistent season in the Remco-Highland Tire - Gilbert Electric sponsored no. 61, Don is the 1982 Silver Spring Speedway Rookie-of-the-Year in the Sportsman Division.





### Vance Yinger No. 20

12th Place - 890 Points 6 Top Ten Finishes Failed to Qualify 5 Times

Last year Vance Yinger missed the top fifteen in points after having finished in the top fifteen five years in-a-row. This year Vance and car owner Clyde Enser were ready for the racing season and Vance once again was back into the top fifteen. The double points were the strong point for Vance this year as he finished in the top ten in two of the three races. Although he finishes in the top ten six times during the year, Vance was a consistent 11th and 12th place finisher in the Yinger Greenhouse sponsored no. 20.

### Don Harnesberger No. 25




### **Anthony Greener No. 61**

By putting together this outstanding season in his first full year of racing, Tony Greener has been named the 1982 Silver Spring Speedway Rookie-of-the-Year.





### Jay Jones No. 69

1982 was another successful season for Jay Jones and his Ed's Quality Cars - Griff's Alignment no. 69 Camaro. Although he ran Silver Spring Speedway on a part-time basis, Jay was a contender for a win everytime he was on the track. Jay ran 15 races this year and he had an amazing 11 top ten finishes and he had four other finishes that were in the top twenty. Jay had five top finishes in a row the last five races and one of those finishes was a fourth place in the Limited Late Model 50.

### Sam Gipe No. 98




### Steve Wolfe No. 5




### **Bob Fannasy No. 222**

Failed To Qualify 4 Times



15th Place - 795 Points 8 Top Ten Finishes 2 Heat Wins Failed to Qualify 4 Times


